

#### DANISH LANGUAGE CLASSES

Winter Semester is starting in January 2024! We have 3 classes including Beginners and Intermediate on Mondays. Beginner classes will be in person and Intermediate class will be Hybrid (part in person and part on Zoom)

#### The schedule is:

Beginner class will meet on Mondays, from 5:00pm, starting on: *Monday, January 22, 2024 (last class April 22, 2024)*

#### **Danish House Society Scholarship Applications**

DHS offers several scholarships: one at \$2,500 from the estate of Ruth and Johannes Pedersen, one at \$2,000 from the Danish Sisterhood of America, Lodge 179, and up to 9 at \$1,500 from the DHS.

To be considered for any of these scholarships, you must be of Danish heritage, with either yourself or a close family member (parent, grandparent, sibling, aunt or uncle) a paid up member of the Danish House Society, for at least one year. If you are not of Danish heritage, you may still qualify if you are a DHS member or connected through family to a member of the Danish House Society.

You must be a resident of British Columbia working towards a degree or diploma at an accredited post-secondary institution (the institution can be outside of BC).

Be of good character and provide 3 current written references: at least one from a high school or college/university administrator or faculty member, and the remainder from other sources, including an employer, if applicable. References are to be current, dated, and signed; if electronically submitted, should clearly show the source.

Your application MUST include:

- a. Your letter, typed, one-sided, on standard 8 ½ x 11 letter-sized paper, maximum 2 pages
- b. Your name, mailing address (or addresses, local and at your place of study if that is out-of-province), phone number, email address
- c. Your Danish House connection, with name(s) and relationship to you
- d. Reasons for requesting the scholarship; your goals
- e. A brief description of your personal interests
- f. Any volunteer experience, especially with DHS
- g. The institution you will be attending, with proof of registration, and student ID number
- h. Transcripts of your past performance, showing latest marks. From high school if you are starting first year; from university, college or institute if applicable
- i. Three references, as described above, 8 ½ x 11 only.




#### GUEST SPEAKERS -



#### The Vancouver Holocaust Education Centre needs our help!

The Vancouver Holocaust Education Centre of Vancouver (<a href="https://www.vhec.org/">https://www.vhec.org/</a>) is developing an exhibit and education program that will be launched in early 2024. The exhibit's theme will be "Rescuers," emphasizing the rescue of Denmark's Jewish population in 1943. The role that Danes played in this historic event presents us with the concepts of moral choices and decisions. Whereas there were individual rescuers of Jews in other parts of Second World War-occupied Europe, the Danish episode is unique as it involved thousands of "ordinary" Danes who saved their fellow countrymen.

The Danish people helped many Jewish civilians escape from Nazi's during World War II (1940-1945). Do you happen to know of someone that helped the Jewish people escape from the Nazi's? How did they help them escape? Do you have a story or pictures, letters or artifacts to share?

Next September (in 2024) the Vancouver Holocaust Education Centre would like to share these stories, letters, pictures, artifacts with high school students. They would appreciate any information that you can share with them and honor the Danish contributions to the war effort.
